(Note: This form is a model form of the NYS Office of Real Property Services. It should be noted that under the provisions of the RPTL Section 526(2): The tentative assessment roll shall be available for public inspection from the date the tentative roll is completed and filed until and including the day or days the board of assessment review meets to hear complaints. The assessor or his or her designee is required to be in attendance with such roll at a specified place during a period of at least four hours not necessarily continuous between nine o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock in the evening on at least four days during the public inspection period prior to the day such board is required to meet to hear complaints; provided that at least two such days shall be at least ten days subsequent to the filing of the tentative assessment roll, of which one day shall be a Saturday. On at least one of the four days the assessor(s) or his/her designee, are required to be in attendance with the roll for at least four hours on at least one of the four days.
