- 1) Supervisor Frank called the Public Hearing to order 6:30pm
- 2) Clerk Moore read the proof of publication that was sent to Watertown Daily Times
- 3) Supervisor Frank opened the floor for public comments
 - Councilman Jackson wondered if the board decides to go ahead with creating a water district would the money have to be in next years budget
 - Budget Officer Ryan said the budget can always be amended if the board decides to go ahead with the water district
 - Councilwoman McIntosh had question about people that had salt contamination problems but lived too far out to be in the water district. They decided those questions should be asked to someone from the NYS DOT
 - Supervisor Frank will contact representative from NYS DOT and ask they come to a meeting
